

## **Assurance of Growth**

Memory Verse: "No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God is faithful who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able but with the temptation will also make the way of escape, that you may be able to bear it." -1 Cor. 10:13

God has made us His children and He intends for us to grow up "in Christ". His first step in saving us is to save us from the penalty of sin. Being saved from the penalty of sin (justification) is a one time, irreversible, judicial event where God takes our sin away and gives us Christ's righteousness the moment we trust Christ. We don't feel anything but our guilty verdict goes to "not guilty". Once we're saved from the penalty of sin now God intends to save us from the power of sin.



As a child of God I now have two natures which battle for the control of my heart (mind, will, emotions). I have the old nature (the flesh) and I have the new nature (Christ in me). The power of sin in me is rooted in the old nature —my old heart (the flesh). I now need saved daily from the power of sin in me. Being saved from the **penalty of sin** (justification) is a once & done event that gives me an eternal position in Christ and ensures I'm on my way to heaven. Being saved from the **power of sin** (sanctification) is a life-long process that requires God to rescue me daily from my old nature.
